J. G. Farrell - Author

It was recently reported in the press that the novelist JG Farrell had been awarded a special Booker Prize for his 1970 novel "Troubles". This book has been retrospectively chosen as the best novel of the year 1970. On May 2010 it was announced that 'Troubles' had won the Lost Booker Prize awarded to books that lost out due to rule changes.

He won the Booker Prize in 1970 and would have been a double Booker winner had he still been living today.

Sadly Farrell was drowned in 1979 while fishing in Bantry Bay, and it is not widely remembered that in his schooldays he lived for several years in Shankill, where his parents owned the house named "The Gwanda", later "Melmore", near Rathmichael Church. The family moved to Dalkey in 1953 because of his father's health problems, but JG Farrell can rightly be claimed as a distinguished former resident of Shankill.

The HSE are advertising for sale by tender the lands consisting of the site encompassing Shankill Health Centre and associated lands at Lower Road, Shankill, Co Dublin.

The proposed disposal is in anticipation of the development of an appropriate, modern health facility on site which will serve the Community of Shankill with a broader range of services into the future. Health service provision in Shankill has recently been enhanced in line with the Primary Care Development Strategy. It is now necessary to construct an appropriate facility in Shankill to further support greater integration of General Practice and HSE services and to ensure a single point of entry to a greater range of accessible services to the community.

Through a Public/Private partnership arrangement it is proposed to develop a facility on the current site for use as a Primary Care centre. Such an arrangement will ensure a direct referral pathway for all patients to a service centre which will deliver a comprehensive range of professional health services within one location. These will include General Practice, Speech and Language Therapy, Physiotherapy, Occupational Therapy and Public Health Nursing services. In addition a minor procedures treatment facility will be present together with enhanced services for the elderly including a podiatry clinic and dietetics.

The HSE is committed to the continuous development and improvement in accessible services for the community of Shankill.

Shankill Teams Shine Through Clouds In Brady's Under 9 Soccer Tournament

After what seemed like weeks of sunshine the rain chose the day of Brady's under 9 tournament to remind us who's the real boss of the Irish weather scene. Fortunately, the Shanganagh Park pitches were parched enough to absorb a night of downpour but arriving parents and players struggled from cars with that bedraggled "What the - (bad word) season is this?" demeanour so characteristic of Irish Summer residents.

But while the tournament kicked off in an atmosphere that was somewhat less than festive all climate issues were forgotten as boot struck ball and the first tackles went in. In the first round of games Ardmore emerged as favourites after a 5-0 victory against Shankill 2 while Shankill 1 took full advantage of a St Joseph's goalkeeping mistake to shade a 1-0 victory. The Shankill Under 8 team, coming in bravely as last minute replacements for Park Celtic, also got off to a flying start beating Carriglea 2-1.

By the time of the midday meal break the weather had cleared a little. Brendan Yates and his catering team created another ray of sunshine by providing the players, and the odd team manager, with free burgers and hot dogs. After 4 matches in the round robin league format Shankill 1 were neck and neck with tournament favourites Ardmore having played out a scoreless draw with them. Shankill 2 shared joint 3rd spot with St Joseph's while the Under 8s were more than holding their own with two victories and 2 defeats by the odd goal.

The burgers must have disagreed with Ardmore. After the break they stumbled to two draws against Joey's and Carriglea. And as the tournament drew towards its conclusion in far more cheerful weather than it began, Shankill 1 required just a draw against Shankill 2 to lift the trophy outright. But Shankill 2 had been quietly creeping up the standings. Should they win this game, both teams would play off again for first place.

This was a very local derby with no quarter given. But after 6 previous games tiredness was setting in. After a bright start some of the Shankill 1 team in particular looked out on their feet. Shankill 2 pressed hard but couldn't prise open the solid defense of their opponents and a 0-0 draw was probably a fair result. The trophy would decorate the sideboards of the Shankill 1 team for the coming year.

The final tournament placings saw Ardmore take runners up slot, Joeys were third followed closely by Shankill 2. One point separated 2nd, 3rd and 4th places. And Shankill 2 was only a goal away from finishing joint top.

The Shankill Under 8s got a well-deserved 5th slot followed by Carriglea, Ballybrack and Glencormac. The Under 8s gave many of the older teams a fright - leading Ardmore 1-0 and losing to the tournament winners through an own goal. Sean Mulhall starred for the Under 8s tormenting opposition defenses and scoring three of their goals. Sean Schutte was always busy in midfield and a constant attacking threat moving forward. Defensive trio Jack Kinsella, Louis Kelleher and Luke Weir were also outstanding against more experienced opposition attackers.

The annual Under 9s tournament is a tribute to the generosity of Brady's Pub who not only provide trophy and medals but water for the players and a meal and drink for every participant afterwards. The club is also very grateful to the Brady's bar staff who refereed the games with an easygoing assurance that contributed much to the smooth running of the day. There were many comments on how smoothly the tournament ran which was down to the host clubs' scheduler Andy Walsh and a top class organising committee who solved a plethora of last minute hitches to get the show on the road.

Out and About and Off the Beaten Track

All the pieces at our meeting had at least some connection with the above theme, but some of the links were a bit tenuous! The evening started and ended with marches. The first was a short and cheerful piece "Zouch, his march" by an unknown composer from around 1600, played on mainly plucked string instruments of the time by a small quartet led by the American lutenist James Tyler.

The next piece could hardly have made a greater contrast. It was "From the Steeples and the Mountains", composed in 1901-2 by the American composer Charles Ives (1874-1954). Ives was a remarkable musician. He was the son of a military bandsman, trained as a musician, but pursued a successful full-time career in the insurance industry. His compositional style was very advanced and very little of his music was performed in his lifetime, including the piece we heard, which was first performed in the 1960s. It was performed by a small (but very loud!) group of brass, timpani and bells, drawn from the London Gabrieli Brass Ensemble, directed by Christopher Larkin, in an idiom that sounds avant-garde even today!

We next heard "Lieder eines fahrenden Gesellen" (Songs of a Wayfarer), by Gustav Mahler (1860-1911). This cycle of four songs deals mainly with the familiar romantic theme

of love, with several of the songs making use of imagery from nature. The singer in this recording, from 1987, was the greatly-missed Irish mezzo-soprano Bernadette Greevy, with Janos Furst, who also died within the last few years, conducting the National Symphony Orchestra of Ireland.

Back to more modern music next, with a suite of five piano pieces "Out of Doors" by Bela Bartok (1881-1945). This piece drew on some of the mood of vigorous folkdances and folk instruments. The most remarkable movement was the fourth, the Night-Music, which was a quiet and atmospheric portrait of the sounds of nature by night. The pianist was the American Max Levinson, familiar to Irish audiences as the winner of the 1997 Dublin International Piano Competition.

The short final movement of the Bartok was a lively picture of a hunt ("The Chase"). Another hunting movement came next, in the form of the finale of the Symphony No 73 "La Chasse" by Joseph Haydn (1732-1809). The brassy sound of the authentic instruments, natural horns in this performance, by the Hanover Band, directed from the harpsichord by Roy Goodman, conveyed the full spirit of the outdoors.

After the interval, we heard three pieces from the piano

suite "On an Overgrown Path" written by the Moravian-Czech composer Leos Janacek (1854-1928) in the early years of the 20th century, at a troubled time in the composer's life. Some of the pieces in the suite are reminiscences of happier times, but many are tinged with sadness; of the three we heard, perhaps the most poignant was the last (No 10 of the set), whose title has been translated sometimes as "The Barn-Owl has Not Flown Away", and sometimes as "The Bird of Ill-Omen Lingers On". This piece recalls a legend that the ominous call of the owl foretells a death in the family, and recalled for Janacek the recent death of his daughter. The soundtrack for the 1988 film "The Unbearable Lightness of Being", based on the novel of 1984 by the Czech writer Milan Kundera, drew heavily on Janacek's music, and the recordings we heard were taken from the soundtrack, played by the eminent Czech pianists Ivan Klansky and Ivan Moravec.

The longest piece of the evening was the *Third Symphony* of the great Finnish composer **Jean Sibelius** (1865-1957), played by the Gothenburg Symphony Orchestra, conducted by Neeme Jarvi. This three-movement symphony, first performed in 1908, marked a new concision and maturity in the composer's symphonic style, coming some seven years after the more popular and larger-scale second. Indeed, the new style puzzled audiences somewhat, an aspect on which the composer is reputed to have ruefully compared notes with his great contemporary Mahler, who had experienced a similar reaction to his own musical innovations!

Finally, another march, and a return to brass music. This was the occasional piece "The Padstow Lifeboat" written by the English composer Malcom Arnold (1921-2006) in 1967, when he was living in the Cornish seaside village of Padstow. Arnold had been a professional trumpeter with major symphony orchestras, and always retained a love of brass band music. He composed this swinging march for the local brass band in the village, and tied it to its origin by including a prominent role for a foghorn-like chord, which punctuates the music with its insistent blare, to comic effect, irrespective of the key of the rest of the music. The glorious performance by the illustrious Grimethorpe Colliery Band, conducted by

the composer, rounded off the evening, and the season, in a boisterous mood.

The Shankill Classical Music Club meets on the first Wednesday of each month at the Old Folks' Association centre on Lower Road at 7.45pm. New members are always welcome. Our next meeting will be on 1st September when we will hold our AGM in the first part of the evening, followed by a short programme of music.



As Chairperson of the Environment, Culture and Community Development Strategic Policy Committee of the Council I welcome the allocation.







'The Story of Hope and Inspiration' by Veronica O'Leary

Published by Bray Cancer Support Centre.

This is the remarkable story of how the Bray Cancer Support Centre which is to the forefront in providing much needed psychological support and practical help to thousands of people each year with its Drop In Centre on Main Street, Bray, Co. Wicklow, serving County Wicklow and South Dublin and operates these in partnership with the H.S.E. came to be established.

In 1976 the author was diagnosed with malignant melanoma when she was aged 21 and made a successful recovery only to suffer a recurrence six years later and told that she had only 3 months to live, did not die as expected, was offered surgery and made a full recovery.

In February 1990 Veronica O'Leary knew what she wanted to do as she did not want anyone to go through what she had gone through and using her own experience of the previous 14 years as a template, determined that no-one that no-one would sufferer would suffer the pain and isolation that she had suffered and this resulted in the formation of the Bray Cancer Support Centre.





